Organic Certification





- Farming organically is an important aspect of Magners farm.
- Despite not being organically certified Kylie still farmed as though the farm was organic from the very beginning.
- After a two year transition phase the farm was certified organic.
- The premium obtained for organic eggs has been essential to the viability of the business in its early stages.

Support Networks

- Support networks are essential for all new entrants, they allow new entrants to confide in and seek advice from peers who can point them in the right direction.
- This is especially important in times of difficulty and often provides the motivation to push on and grow the business.
